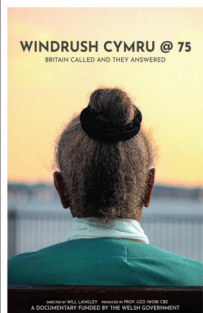
4th – 11th Feb, 5th & 6th March
POOR THINGS (18)
Yorgos Lanthimos, UK/USA 2023, AD, 142mins

Brimming with award nominations, Emma Stone and Willem Dafoe star in this acclaimed and quirky tale of a young woman brought back to life by an unorthodox scientist. Eager to learn and hungry for the worldliness she is lacking, she runs off on a whirlwind adventure across the continents. THE HOLDOVERS (15)
Alexander Payne, USA 2023, AD, 133mins

Paul Giamatti is wonderful as a cumudgeonly instructor at a 1970s New England prep school who's forced to remain on campus during Christmas break babysitting the handful of students with nowhere to go. Despite his clear loathing, an unlikely bond begins to form between himself, the school's head cook, and a rebellious troublemaker. A moving, warm and witty comedy-drama of the kind that people simply don't make anymore.

ONE LIFE (12A)
James Hawes, UK 2023, AD, 109mins

Sir Anthony Hopkins stars alongside Jonathan Pryce and Helena Bonham Carter in this remarkable true story of Nicholas Winton, a young London broker who visited Prague during the rise of Nazi Germany. Seeing the imminent danger to Jewish children, he realised it was only a matter of time before the borders closed, and began a daring rescue attempt to help them flee. 50 years later, still racked with guilt over those he couldn't save, he comes face to face with those he did...

Frank Capra, USA 1934, 105mins

Remastered in 4K for Valentine's Day, for one night only, Clark Gable and Claudette Colbert team up as mismatched lovers in this screwball comedy classic. Spoiled Ellie Andrews escapes from her millionaire father to avoid marrying a worthless playboy, but en route to New York, winds up stuck with an out-of-work newsman instead. When their bus breaks down, the bickering couple set off on a madcap hitchhiking expedition... Directed by Frank Capra, it was the first film to win all five major Oscars (Best Picture, Best Actor, Best Actress, Best Director, and Best Screenplay.)

ZONE OF INTEREST (12A)
Jonathan Glazer, UK 2023, AD, 105mins

The commandant of Auschwitz, Rudolf Höss, and his wife Hedwig, strive to build a dream life for their family in a house and garden next to the camp. A deeply chilling and grimly fascinating study into the façade of ordinary life, and how easy it can be to mask the true horror that's literally on the doorstep. Highly recommended and completely unforgettable. Nominated for nine BAFTAs and five Academy Awards.

Benjamin Renner, USA 2023, 83mins

From the creators of Minions and Despicable Me, this fun animated comedy follows a family of ducks who try to convince their overprotective father to go on the vacation of a lifetime.

ALL OF US STRANGERS (15)
Andrew Haigh, UK 2023, AD, 106mins

One night, Adam (Andrew Scott) has a chance encounter with a mysterious neighbour Harry (Paul Mescal). As a relationship develops, Adam becomes preoccupied with memories of the past, and after visiting his childhood home discovers his parents appear to be living there, just as they were on the day they died, 30 years before... Nominated for six BAFTA awards.

Cord Jefferson, USA 2023, AD, 117mins

But when it becomes a huge hit, he finds himself trapped inside the very hypocrisy he was raging against. Clever, funny and a biting cultural satire that earned five Oscar nominations.

Thea Sharrock, UK 2023, AD, 100mins

It's the 1920s, and the inhabitants of a sleepy town are about to be drawn into a foul mouthed mystery when Edith (Olivia Colman) starts to receive obscene letters. Although she immediately blames her much younger, ruder neighbour (Jesse Buckley), the local police believe something is amiss and, together with a group of resourceful women, endeavour to find who's really capable of spreading such filth around this harmless little seaside town... Also stars Timothy Spall.

Maria Torrellas, Argentina 2016, 84mins

OPPENHEIMER
Christopher Nolan, USA 2023, AD, 180mins

Nominated for 13 BAFTAs and 13 Oscars (and guaranteed to sweep the board), this is a last chance to see the film everyone's talking about, up on the big screen as it was meant to be experienced. Against the backdrop of World War II, scientist J Robert Oppenheimer (Cillian Murphy) is enlisted by the Americans to help them win the race against the Nazis to develop the most frightening weapon the world has ever seen: the atomic bomb.

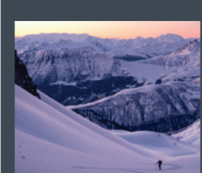
